Dear ACES, TAS, WAHS Faculty, Staff and Parents,

As stated in CEO's Communique regarding School Closure, TAS' Directors and Department Leaders have prepared guidelines and protocols in the following areas:

- A plan to provide opportunities for continuous, academic learning for students
- A plan for continuing meal services for students, given that food insecurity is a reality in the communities we serve
- A plan for compensation for employees (see separate communication from HR dept.)
- A plan to provide on-going mental health and health services to students in need

Please reference below for our recommendations during School Closure.

### **Food Services:**

We have implemented the following food services program to begin March 16. Both breakfast and lunch meals will be available at our front gate area, located at 4000 S. Main St. in Los Angeles. To limit exposure to our students and staff, we will offer a drive-up service which will be available from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM, Monday through Friday, during school closure. We ask that parents and/or guardians drive to our front gate where they will be met with a food services representative. Each child will be given two meals; one meal will be lunch for the day and the other meal will be breakfast for the following day.

This program is not limited to only students of our schools, but also to siblings, additional family members, and neighbors of the surrounding TAS community. For families that do not have access to a vehicle, we will also have a walk-up area, located at the front gate, where we will distribute the meals.

### **Health Services:**

In order to ensure continued support to our students receiving counseling services, a letter will be posted on the District's website outlining community resources that are available to students should the need arise to access those services.

Our Registered School Nurse will be available by phone or livechat to address any health services related questions or concerns raised by parents or students that would be asked during a typical school day.

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### **Special Education:**

Our Resource Specialist Program (RSP) teachers at ACES, TAS and WAHS will be available by phone as well as online to provide customized instructional support to students with disabilities as they engage in the learning experiences identified below.

### Technology:

Teachers will distribute standard chromebooks and power supply to students grades 2-12 at TAS/WAHS and grades 2-6 at ACES on 03/13/20. Teachers will sign out laptops to students towards the end of the day for elementary grades and during Period 6 for WAHS and Period 7 for TAS MS using a roster, provided by IT, as a means to track the return of the laptops. **Please return this Roster sheet back to the Main Office before you leave for the day. The roster will require a student signature, a teacher signature, and the computer number if the label is available.** Chromebooks should be placed in backpacks upon leaving for the day on 3/13/20. If a student does not have a backpack, a bag will be provided to house the chromebook and power supply, as it is expected to rain 03/13/20. Students will be provided a letter with all relevant information on how to log in and access the computer through Clever. A tech number will be provided, which will include hours available, for any student who is having hardware or log in issues.
